#### Daily Update – March 31, 2020

Page, AZ (March 31, 2020) – The City of Page continues to collaborate with community and outside government entities to combat the COVID-19 threat. One of the issues our community is grappling with is rumor control since information regarding COVID-19 is constantly changing and it can become difficult to know which information sources are reliable. The City of Page works diligently to dispel rumors as appropriate and we continue to use [www.cityofpage.org](http://www.cityofpage.org) as a reliable source of information for the community. The following is some current information affecting our community:

- **Senior Lunch Programs:** Lunches are still being provided for our senior citizens (age 60 and over). Interested persons may contact the Page Community Center at 928-645-2600 (8:00am–4:00pm Mon-Thurs) for more information. Please note that seniors must be able to pick up their meals.
- **Page Police Department:** The police department is battling a rumor that a curfew is in place for the City of Page. This is a false rumor. There is a curfew in place on the Navajo Nation, however, it does not affect the City of Page. Additionally, area law enforcement does not have any role in enforcing the Navajo Nation curfew.
- **Scam Alert:** Senior citizens are often some of our most vulnerable community members. Unfortunately, there has been an uptick in scams during this difficult time that are targeting seniors. These scams include offering false investment opportunities, medical equipment, COVID-19 vaccines (that do not exist currently), hospitalization insurance, senior shopping scams, and home sanitation services. The Page Police Department warns our seniors to be extra vigilant in protecting themselves from these scams, and request that family members of vulnerable adults take steps to help them avoid becoming a victim. **Remember:** *If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is.*

The City of Page continues to encourage residents of the greater Page community to maintain social distancing and comply with the required prevention guidelines.
