Daily Update – March 30, 2020

Page, AZ (March 30, 2020) – This afternoon the City government received notice of Governor Ducey’s executive order (2020-18) announcing his “Stay Home, Stay Healthy, Stay Connected” policy that “promotes physical distancing while also encouraging social connectedness”. The policy builds upon other actions taken by the governor in response to the COVID-19 threat. According to the governor’s office, “The intent of this Executive Order is to ensure that people maintain physical distance to the maximum extent feasible, while enabling essential services to continue, protecting people’s rights and slowing the spread of COVID-19 to the greatest extent possible.”

The governor’s order states that “all individuals in the State of Arizona shall limit their time away from the place of residence or property”, except:

1. To conduct or participate in essential activities; or
2. For employment, to volunteer or participate in essential functions; or
3. To utilize any services or products provided by essential businesses; or
4. For employment, if as a sole proprietor or family owned business, work is conducted in a separate office space from your home and the business is not open to serve the public.
