

2018 Youth Flag Football Information

Emphasizing good sportsmanship, skill development, and equal participation, Page Recreation gives youth a community based, non-competitive program to learn sport specific skills and play games in a safe, organized and fun environment.

1. Register on-line with any computer or phone at <https://cityofpage.recdesk.com/Community/Program>
2. Have staff help you register on-line at the Recreation Department, Page Public Library or Page Community Center
3. Fill out a paper form and pay at Page City Hall Monday – Thursday; 7 AM - 5:30 PM
4. Download a registration form at www.cityofpage.org/departments/recreation-dept and leave it with payment in the afterhours deposit box at Page City Hall.
5. Pick up a paper registration form at the Recreation Department or request to have the Recreation Department email or text a registration form to you to submit with payment at Page City Hall.

Deadline: Registrations and fees will be accepted only on-line or at City Hall August 23 - **September 12**. Late registration is not guaranteed. If space remains after **September 13**, late registrations *may* be accepted with an additional \$10.00 late fee. If late registrations are accepted, late shirts may not arrive until after team photos are scheduled.

Fees: **\$50/child** Cubs, Bobcats, Panthers (Grades 2-8) leagues; **\$40/child** Kits (Grades K-1) league. *Coaches may be eligible for a free future registration voucher.*

Coaches: In this community-based league, all coaches are volunteers. We encourage parents, grandparents, and 16+ year old siblings, to coach their players’ teams. At the end of the season coaches who have completed all requirements may be eligible to receive a **free future registration**, and assistant coaches may be eligible to receive a half-price future registration. Please contact the Recreation Department at 928-645-4380/4381 for more details and to obtain volunteer forms. **Volunteer forms and concussion training must be completed annually before coaches’ mandatory organizational meetings.**

Teams/Equipment:

- **Requests to put players on teams together or with specific coaches will not be accepted.** Players are sorted to create similarly skilled teams and these types of requests contribute to unequal teams. Coaches will coach their child’s team, and siblings in the same grade will be put together. No other effort will be made to place players on specific teams.
- One team shirt and mouth guard are included with registration. Additional mouth guards may be purchased for \$1 each.
- Cleats (non-metal) may be worn but are not required.
- **Shoe exchange:** Beginning September 3, football cleats may be dropped off at the Sports Complex for donation. Beginning October 1, participants may select shoes for their own use (See website or Facebook for further details).

Divisions/Games: Games may be played at 5:30 or 6:30 PM. Schedules subject to change based on final number of teams.
