- Priority to work closely with professional and business communities to identify the gaps in our community that deter professionals and employees from staying in Page. - Address and develop a redundant water supply for the City of Page, ensuring long-term reliability and sustainability of water resources.
- Promote affordable housing options.

- Expand community recreational programs beyond sports, including opening the PERA Club for community use and encouraging residents to propose offerings for classes, workshops, and events for all age groups beyond sports.
- Establish a birth-to-K care facility for children, addressing a critical need for families.
- Continue Support of family-friendly events and festivals throughout the year.
- Continue Improvements of local parks and outdoor spaces for community gatherings.
- Establish a committee to collaborate with businesses in the Industrial Park, focusing on their needs and challenges to improve infrastructure, roadways to attract new businesses.
